## **A NEW HOME FOR JA FINANCE PARK**

In October 2024, JA New York relocated *JA Finance Park* to a new, permanent facility at 230 West 38th Street in the heart of Manhattan. This updated space expands our capacity to deliver transformative financial literacy and personal budgeting education to students.

During its first full year of operation, **more than 6,000 students** completed the Finance Park capstone experience. Prior to their visit, students complete JA's classroom curriculum, building foundational knowledge in budgeting, saving, credit, and long-term financial planning. Their learning culminates in an immersive, in-person simulation at the new facility, where each student assumes the role of an adult for a day—managing expenses, making real-time decisions, and applying the financial concepts they have studied.

This practical, hands-on experience strengthens students' confidence and helps them understand how everyday financial choices shape long-term opportunities and outcomes.

**JA STOCK MARKET CHALLENGE:  
EXPANDING STUDENTS' EXPOSURE TO FINANCIAL MARKETS**

Now in its second year, the *JA Stock Market Challenge* continues to broaden access to hands-on financial education for high school students across the region. In 2024–25, students who participated in our *JA Take Stock in Your Future* curriculum were invited to compete in the simulation-based competition. In April 2025, more than 100 students from the Greater New York area competed locally, and the three top performing teams advanced to represent JA New York in the national competition which took place in May in Atlanta.

*JA Take Stock in Your Future* and the *JA Stock Market Challenge* place students in the role of investors managing a fictional portfolio while responding to real-time market updates and news. Through this dynamic experience, students deepen their understanding of global markets, diversification strategies, risk, and the ways current events influence financial decision-making. As the program continues to grow, it provides students with meaningful, practical exposure to concepts that shape financial behaviors and long-term economic outcomes.
